7. Online Webinar on 'PASSION OTHER THAN SURGERY' on 27.04.23.





A series of pictorial essays reflecting on how our practice has evolved over millennia

Section 1: Prehistory and antiquity



Surgery as we know of the speciality today, is a far cry from what initially began during pre-historic times, a rudimentary and sometimes barbaric, by current standards an attempt to treat injuries due to trauma and then subsequently due to disease for example "trepanation" (Fig 1). It wasnt until the 1900s that the likelihood of surviving surgery was greater than the likelihood of dying during or as a result of surgery! Numerous masters and breakthroughs - some accidental and others due to the scientific application of the human mind have resulted in the practice of modern surgery, where complex life-saving surgical procedures are performed routinely, saving thousands of lives on a daily basis. This development and progress is likely to continue and when the history of surgery is reflected upon a millenia later, our current techniques will no doubt be considered rudimentary !

1. Prehistory and antiquity

Certainly, early Physicians who branched into trying to treat deformity and trauma were ingenious like tribes in India and South America developed an ingenious method of sealing minor injuries by applying termites or scarabs who bit the edges of the wound and then twisted the insects' neck, leaving their heads rigidly attached like staples. A combination of archaeological and anthropological studies offer insight into much earlier techniques for suturing lacerations, amputating unsalvageable limbs, and draining and cauterizing open wounds. Many examples exist: some Asian tribes used a mix of saltpeter and sulfur that was placed onto wounds and lit on fire to cauterize wounds; the Dakota people used the quill of a feather attached to an animal bladder to suck out purulent material; the discovery of needles from the Stone Age seems to suggest they were used in the suturing of cuts (the Maasai used needles of acacia for the same purpose).

Earliest recorded below knee amputation in a child who subsequently survived for many years into early adulthood (Nature volume 609, 547-551 (2022), demonstrating that the distal third of the left lower leg was removed through deliberate surgical amputation with remodeled bone covering the amputation surfaces and demonstrating healing.



These ancient surgeon(s)' who amputated this individual's lower left leg must have understood the necessity to remove the limb for survival, possessed detailed knowledge of limb anatomy and muscular and vascular systems to prevent fatal blood loss and infection. Intensive post-operative nursing and care would have been vital including pain relief, regular feeding and movement to prevent bed sores while the individual was immobile. Although it is not possible to determine whether infection occurred after the surgery, this individual evidently did not suffer from an infection severe enough to leave permanent skeletal markers and/or cause death. This comprehensive knowledge of human anatomy, physiology, and surgical procedures evident in this community is likely to have been developed by trial and error over a long period of time and transmitted inter generationally through oral traditions of learning. Notably, it remains unknown whether this 'operation' was a rare and isolated event in the history of this region, or if this particular foraging society had achieved an unusually high degree of proficiency in this area.

Note: This area also contains some of the earliest known rock art confirming the existence of advanced degree of creativity in homo sapiens of the region. ...(contd.)



Until this discovery last year (2022), it was generally thought that the evolution of medicine was due to the emergence of settled agricultural societies around 10,000 years ago (the Neolithic Revolution) which gave rise to a host of health problems that had previously been unknown among non- sedentary foraging populations, stimulating the first major innovations in prehistoric medical practices. Such changes included the development of more advanced surgical procedures, including that of an 'operation' in an European Neolithic farmer (found in Buthiers-Boulancourt, France) whose left forearm had been surgically removed and then partially healed (6000 BC).

Anatomy and empirical studies

The different parts or members of the body as mentioned before including the skin, cannot be correctly described by one who is not well versed in anatomy. Hence, any one desirous of acquiring a thorough knowledge of anatomy should prepare a dead body and carefully, observe, by dissecting it, and examine its different parts.

Sushruta Samhita

Sushruta (born and lived in the Kingdom of Kasi, where it is believed that he learnt medicine from Lord Dhanavantri himself) wrote the Sushruta Samhita as an instruction manual for physicians to treat their patients holistically. This treatise addresses all aspects of general medicine, but the impressive chapters on surgery have led to the false impression that this is its main topic. The Suśrutasamhitā is of great historical importance because it includes historically unique chapters describing surgical training, instruments and procedures which are still followed by the modern science of surgery. Disease, he claimed (following the precepts of Charaka), was caused by imbalance in the body, and it was the physicians duty to help others maintain balance or to restore it if it had been lost.



To this end, anyone who was engaged in the practice of medicine had to be balanced themselves. Sushruta describes the ideal medical practitioner, focusing on a nurse, in this way:

That person alone is fit to nurse, or to attend the bedside of a patient, who is coolheaded and pleasant in his demeanor, does not speak ill of anyone, is strong and attentive to the requirements of the sick, and strictly and indefatigably follows the instructions of the physician

It is generally accepted that the author of the original 'text' (first five chapters/Sthanas) was 'elder Sushruta' (Vrddha Sushruta). Numerous other ancient authors were collectively called 'Suśruta' who also contributed to subsequent versions of this text/first 'layer' of the manuscript. The book was redacted centuries later by another Sushruta, then subsequently by Nagarjuna (a Buddhist) and thereafter 'Uttara-tantra' was added as a supplement. The Sushruta Samhita was composed after Charaka Samhita, and except for some topics and their emphasis, both discuss many similar subjects such as General Principles, Pathology, Diagnosis, Anatomy, Sensorial Prognosis, Therapeutics, Pharmaceutics and Toxicology. The Sushruta and Charaka texts differ in one major aspect, with Sushruta Samhita providing the foundation of surgery, while Charaka Samhita being primarily a foundation of medicine

Followers of Sushrutha were called Saushrutas. Before starting their training, Saushrutas took a solemn oath to devote themselves to healing and to do no harm to others.. After the students had been accepted by Sushruta, he would instruct them in surgical procedures by having them practice cutting on vegetables or dead animals to perfect the length and depth of an incision. Once students had proven themselves capable with vegetation, animal corpses, or with soft or rotting wood – and had carefully observed actual procedures on patients – they were then allowed to perform their own surgeries, from which the tradition of apprenticeship of surgeons has derived.

Before the 19th Century

The concept of surgery was explored well before recorded history with early 'surgeons' grasping the basic concepts of the human anatomy and organ systems. Among some of the notable achievements before the 19th century include

6500 BCE: Skulls found in France show signs of a rudimentary surgery called trepanation, which involves drilling a hole in the skull. 1750 BCE: The Code of Hammurabi, one of the earliest Babylonian codes of laws, details regulation governing surgeons, medical malpractice, and victim's compensation. 1550 BCE: The Ebers Papyrus, an ancient Egyptian medical treaty, includes information on how to surgically treat crocodile bites and serious burns. 600 BCE: Sushruta, regarded as the 'founding father of surgery' was an innovator of plastic surgery, including rhinoplasty.

950: Abulcasis, an Arab physician considered among the greatest medieval surgeons, apparently learned many of his skills from Greek surgeons.

1363: French surgeon Guy de Chauliac writes Chirurgia Magna (Great Surgery), regarded as the standard text for surgeons until well into the 17th century.

1540: English barbers and surgeons unite to form the United Barber- SurgeonsCompany. These 'barber-surgeons' performed tooth extractions and bloodletting.1630: Wilhelm Fabry, known as the 'Father of German Surgery' is recognized as the first surgeon to employ amputation as a treatment for gangrene.

Intra thoracic gangrenous Gastric volvulus

– A case report




Fig 1 : Upper GI Endoscopy showing a grossly distended stomach with distorted anatomy




Fig 2 : Chest X ray showing a Gastric bubble in the left hemithorax with a shift of mediastinum to the right




Fig 4 : Dusky appearance of the stomach noted after detorsion and reduction of contents




Fig 3 : CECT of the thorax showing a grossly distended stomach in the left hemithorax reaching the apex of the lung

A 20 year old young lady was admitted with complaints of severe upper abdominal pain. She was initially being managed as gastritis and USG done elsewhere the previous day was normal. On admission she had tachycardia and tachypnoea, Blood Pressure was stable and abdomen was soft with no tenderness or guarding. We did an Upper GI endoscopy for her where there was a grossly dilated stomach and distorted anatomy (Fig 1). Chest X ray was done which showed a gastric bubble in the thorax (Fig 2). CECT of the thorax also confirmed the same (Fig 3). The patient was taken up for Exploratory thoracolaparotomy. A thoracoabdominal incision was made and access gained to the thorax and abdomen. Grossly dilated stomach with a volvulus noticed through a posterior diaphragmatic defect. The opening was enlarged and the contents reduced. The stomach was dusky (Fig 4).

We thought this could be either due to impending gangrene or bruising of the stomach. The stomach is a very vascular organ and has the possibility of recovery, we did not want to do a morbid procedure like a gastrectomy especially when the demarcation was not clear. Decision was taken to do a relook surgery in 48 hours to assess the condition of the stomach again. Diaphragmatic defect closed and Thorax closed with an ICD. Laparostomy was done. By the end of the surgery the patient needed low dose inotropes to maintain the BP. Overnight the patient's acidosis worsened and the inotropic support increased. ...(contd.)



Intra thoracic gangrenous Gastric volvulus – A case report




Fig 5 : Gangrenous Stomach noted on the first re-exploration surgery and a Subtotal gastrectomy was done.

We had to intervene the following day itself and found a gangrenous stomach involving the majority of the greater curvature (Fig 5) A subtotal gastrectomy was done. Reconstruction was postponed in view of the unstable hemodynamics and a laparostomy was done again.

She got better the next 2 days and was weaned off the inotropes. On day 4 of admission she underwent a Gastrojejunostomy with a feeding jejunostomy and abdominal closure. Her postoperative period was very turbulent as the left lung did not expand in spite of the ICD. Differential diagnosis of a congenital hypoplasia of the lung versus collapse consolidation was made. She could not be weaned off the ventilator and hence she underwent a tracheostomy. Gradually the patient became better and was discharged after a month. She has recently gone back to college and remains asymptomatic.

Discussion:

Necrosis of the gastric volvulus is very rare (5-20%)[1]. In case the volvulus is associated with necrosis the mortality is very high (30-50%)[2]. This is a surgical emergency which needs an exploration and if vascularity is compromised it warrants a resection as per the extent of the gangrene.


