

Byelaw committee proposals for amendments.

Byelaw committee meetings were held under the chairmanship of Dr. Aravind Patel and Dr. Chandrashekar. N. Hon, secretary KSCASI as convenor, 3 meetings were conducted on zoom platform on 6th Jun, 28th Nov and 4th December. All members were present during all the meeting and had a detailed discussion on all proposed amendments which were sent to the byelaw committee. All the members unanimously accepted to propose the following amendments after detailed deliberations.

Deliberations:

1. All the members unanimously accepted to continue medical college and non-medical college area nomenclature, as still many of the members continue to work in rural area and in places where medical colleges are not there. Hence all the members felt that they need to be given space to represent.
2. Since a long time EC members number remains same. As the present member strength has increased, members felt that there is a need to increase the number of EC members. Hence it was recommended to increase the number from existing 9 to 12. Zone wise distribution is recommended by the members of the byelaw committee for a uniform representation across the state. Divisions are based on the Revenue divisions of Karnataka.
3. As non-medical college area EC representation is less and lack of senior people to apply for the chairman post, its recommended to continue elections for chairman elect post 3:1 for medical and non-medical college area.
4. Committee recommended to continue election of KSCASI office-bearers by physical voting during the AGBM. Members expressed that conference registration will increase and more number of people will attend the conference and also people who are interested in the organisation will come for the conference and contest for the election. Hence recommendation was for elections of the office bearers by physical voting during the AGBM.

Abolishing medical and non-medical college area.</p>	<p>Medical and non-medical college area contestant – description As per the EC meeting on 12th February, 2016, a sub committee was formed to bring a change in the present amendment of medical and non-medical controversy. The same matter was brought before the General Body meeting in 2016 at Shivamogga. The GB had accepted & approved the recommendations of the sub -committee. Accordingly, to the GB approved recommendations Medical and Non-medical College areas are defined as follows: Medical college area is defined as the City or Town in which the medical college is situated. The member who is attached to the medical college, and a member practicing in that city or town belongs to the medical college area. For example, 1. Sulya is not a big city but has a medical college, so it comes under the Medical College Area. Non-Medical college Area is defined as the Surgeons practicing in the Place, Taluka or District where there is no medical college. For example, Yadgiri and Chikmagalur are district headquarters but do not have a medical college, so they come under non-medical college area. The population wise description as per the Government policy of urban, semi urban and rural is not considered.</p>	<p>To continue medical college and non-medical college area nomenclature.</p>

The nomination shall be placed upon a ballot and voted for at the Annual General Body Meeting and the candidates securing the highest number of votes shall be declared elected. Physical presence of the contestant is compulsory. Otherwise, votes in favour of him shall be considered invalid. If there is a tie, a coin may be tossed to choose the office bearers.</p> <p>vi.
